These incentives are limited to a maximum of \$3,000 on the district level and \$1,000 on the local club level. So if you are interested, please take advantage of these incentives as soon as possible.

A "Chocolate Breakfast" will be scheduled as our meeting and spouses will be invited as well as other Jefferson City Rotarians and their spouses.
