Of Historical Interest

Henriette Geisberg Bruns, born 28 October 1813 in Stromberg in the Province of Westphalia, married Dr. Bernhard Bruns in 1832, emigrated and settled in Westphalia, Missouri in 1836, moved to Jefferson City in 1853, and died 7 November 1899.

Her life of hardship and adventure, and her attitude in meeting daily challenges, were recorded in letters sent to her family in Germany. At the request of her children she also wrote an autobiography.

Adolf E. Schroeder, Professor Emeritus of Germanic Studies at the University of Missouri-Columbia, spent years translating and editing this valuable material, which has been published as "My Life Story" and "Hold Dear, As Always".
