Greg Frank is Jefferson City Breakfast Club Rotarian of the Week for February 22, 2012

Our Club Rotarian of the Week for February 22, 2012, is Greg Frank. A member only for 7 years since October of 2004, Greg was Club Rotarian of the Year in 2007-2008 and ascended through most of the officer positions to become President last year. This year he is our Club Trainer.

Born in Jefferson City, Greg's grew up in Rich Fountain. He graduated from Fatima High School in Westphalia in 1981. After attending a semester at Central Missouri University, he worked at Pla-Mor Trailers, Inc., for a while and then went to Lincoln University earning an Associate's Degree in Computer Science in 1984.

He started his first career in computer programming—first for state agencies from 1984-1990 with the Department of Revenue and the Missouri State Employees Retirement System, and later for state contractors while computerizing the state's Medicaid System until 2003 as a programmer, supervisor, manager and director. Greg went to night school at Columbia College while working full time and earned a Bachelor's degree in business administration in 1991.

In 2003 he began his new career as a broker and financial advisor with A.G. Edwards, which later became Wells Fargo. In 2009 he joined Smith, Moore & Co., where he presently works. He said, "I discovered that I liked assisting individual clients and couple with financial planning much more than programming and managing people programming computers."

Greg met his wife Cathy at Fatima High School where he was a freshman and she was a sophomore. They later married after he completed high school. She is the church administrator for the Grace Evangelical Free Church.

Greg and Cathy have three children. Elizabeth works at the Old Navy clothing store in Jefferson City. Rachel, an alumnus of the Rotary Youth Leadership Academy, is a hair stylist in Springfield. Harrison is a 12-year-old 6th Grader at Russellville (Greg was on his cell phone at a Boy Scout camp out with Harrison when being interviewed for this article).
