Rotary International President 2000-2001

The new President of Rotary international for 2000-2001 is Frank J. Devlyn of Mexico City-Anahuac, Mexico. He is president and chief executive officer of the Devlyn Optical Group of Mexico, the largest retailer, distributor, and manufacturer of optical products in Latin America, with branches in Mexico, Colombia and Guatemala. He attended the University of Texas at El Paso and graduated from the I.P.A.D.E., a prestigious school of business in Mexico. He is founding editor and director of the Rotary regional magazine, *Rotarismo en Mexico*. He is the recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Distinguished Service Award and its Citation for Meritorious Service for his support of its international humanitarian and educational programs.

President Frank J. Devlyn's key emphases for 2000-01 are:

- Proactive, continuing emphasis on existing Rotary International and Rotary Foundation initiatives, including PolioPlus, literacy, clean water, lost-cost shelters, hunger alleviation, Preserve Planet Earth, at-risk children and other concerns
- Proactive membership development and retention efforts
- Proactive public relations and media awareness campaigns
- Partnerships with other organizations at the club and district levels
- Innovative, proactive approaches to addressing the following concerns:
 - ✓ Population and development, with emphasis on educational programs for girls and women
 - ✓ Avoidable blindness
 - ✓ Poverty, with a focus on village banking and other methods of improving economic conditions for women and children
 - ✓ Crime reduction and violence prevention
