What is available?

Two (2) one year Ambassadorial scholarships

One (1) 6 month Cultural scholarship

Application deadline:

Clubs may establish their own deadline for applicants, but complete applications including the club endorsement page must be received by the chairman no later than April 1, 2001. Applicants must be available for interview by the District committee on April 14.

Applications and a descriptive brochure are available on the Rotary web site (www.rotary.org).

Club should interview applicants and make sure they understand their obligations to Rotary should they be selected and be able to articulate how they will reconcile their personal educational goals and the ambassadorial objectives Rotary seeks to achieve with the scholarships.
